Priorities	Develop an economy based on knowledge and innovation	Promoting a more resource efficient, greener and more competitive economy	Fostering a high employment economy delivering social and territorial cohesion
Targets	75% of the population aged 20-64 should be employed 3% of the EU's GDP should be invested in R&D	The 20/20/20 energy/climate targets should be met greenhouse gas emissions renewable energy energy efficiency	Reducing early school leaving below 10% 40% of 30-34 years old completing 3rd level education 20 million fewer people in poverty or social exclusion

What?

- One of seven flagships in the EU 2020 strategy
- Aiming to respond to the challenges young people face and to help them succeed in the knowledge economy – adopted 15 September 2010
- An integrated strategy for young people, embracing both education/training <u>and</u> employment

Four main actions!





1. Matching – deliver key competences

- Recommendation on reducing early school leaving
- Establish a High Level Group on Literacy
- Raise the attractiveness and quality of VET
- Quality framework for traineeships and reduce obstacles for transnational placements
- Recommendation on promotion and validation of non-formal and informal learning





2. Promoting higher education

- Modernisation of higher education (curricula, funding)
- Reinforced quality assurance
- Opening up opportunities to non-traditional learners and disadvantaged groups
- Benchmarking a multi-dimensional global university ranking system "U-Multirank" (web tool).





3. Transnational learning and mobility

- Youth on the Move website (mobility opportunities)
- Promoting learning mobility through a "Mobility Scoreboard"
- Develop a Youth on the Move Card and a European Skills Passport
- Development of "Your first EURES job"
- Creation of a "European Vacancy Monitor"





4. Youth employment

- Identification of the most effective support measures
- Systematic monitoring of the situation of NEETs
- Increased support to potential young entrepreneurs
- Introducing a "Youth Guarantee"

The European Platform against Poverty and Social Exclusion





Definition of Poverty

• Households at risk of poverty

Threshold is set at 60% of the national median disposable income after social transfer.

Materially deprived

Households which can't afford to pay at least 4 out of 9 given expenditures

Households with low work intensity
Households where adults work less than 20% of their total
work potential





Key actions

- Improved access to work, social security, essential services and education
- Better use of EU-funds to support social inclusion and combat discrimination
- Develop social innovations to find smart solutions
- New partnerships between the public and private sector
- "Social investment package" (SIP)





Youth Employment Initiative

- Proposed in February 2013, budget of 6 billion Euro
- Purpose to financially support the implementation of the Youth Employment Package
- Ex. Youth Guarantees, traineeships, reduction of labour costs, wage and recruitment subsidies, start-up support for young entrepreneurs etc
